

# **HRCS Policy Concerning Gang-Related Activities**

### **Purpose**

HRCS prohibits gang-related and secret-society activity to maintain a safe, disruption-free learning environment on school grounds, in school vehicles, and at school activities or sanctioned events.

#### **Definitions**

- Gang or secret society: Two or more individuals who associate to engage in conduct that is criminal, intimidating, materially disruptive, or otherwise violates law or HRCS policy.
- Indicators (non-exhaustive): Recruitment or intimidation; hand signs; graffiti/tags; and apparel, jewelry, accessories, notebooks, or grooming that—by color/arrangement/trademark/number/phrase—reasonably denotes gang/secret-society affiliation and is linked to intimidation, disruption, or a safety risk. Enforcement is based on specific behaviors and objective indicators, not stereotypes.

Prohibited Conduct (on school grounds, in school vehicles, and at school activities)

- 1. Promoting, recruiting for, organizing, or representing a gang/secret society.
- 2. Intimidation, threats, retaliation, or coercion tied to a gang/secret society.
- 3. Displaying/possessing paraphernalia or symbols with a reasonable nexus to disruption, intimidation, or safety risk.
- 4. Creating/displaying gang/secret-society graffiti.
- 5. Using digital platforms to coordinate or amplify the above in connection with school.

#### **Administrator Actions**

- Direct the student to remove/cover prohibited items when feasible; separate involved students; secure items consistent with the search policy.
- Notify parent/guardian as soon as practicable; document the incident; refer to law enforcement when required.

## **Discipline & Due Process**

Consequences follow <u>HRCS's Conduct & Discipline Code</u> and <u>Suspension/Expulsion Policy</u>, using proportionate, progressive responses and restorative options when appropriate.

# **Students with Disabilities**

When discipline could constitute a change of placement, HRCS follows IDEA/ECEA (including manifestation determination and required services). See "Suspension & Expulsion for Students with Disabilities."
